We advocate for policies that promote high-quality arts education for all students, convene and engage with statewide stakeholders, and equip advocates of all types to speak up for arts education in their schools and communities across California.

**Position Summary:** Create CA seeks an experienced leader to serve as the Executive Director with a deep commitment to equity and a demonstrated passion for the arts. The Executive Director (ED) will be a strong relationship builder, creative problem-solver, and successful advocate, and have a proven track record in setting and executing a strategic vision. Reporting to the Board of Directors, the ED will be responsible for overseeing day-to-day operations, fundraising, and fiduciary management as well as engaging policymakers, and staying informed of relevant legislation and program oversight.

The Executive Director will be inspired by, and excited to achieve, an equitable and inclusive implementation plan for arts education in light of the recent legislation. They will work alongside the Create CA staff and Board of Directors to advance the mission of advocating for arts education for every student across California. The ED will support and foster recent and ongoing organizational growth. The Executive Director will be a skilled listener, understand the importance of collective impact, and have the ability to foster a caring, supportive, and collaborative work environment.

- Provide leadership to advance the organization's mission, goals, and strategic initiatives
- Collaborate with the Board of Directors and Leadership Team to ensure alignment with the organization's strategic plan
- Represent the organization to the public, media, and the arts education community
- Ensure the successful implementation of programs and initiatives that support arts education in California, ensuring their alignment with Create CA's DEIB values, and monitoring their impact and effectiveness

- Provide effective leadership to the organization's staff, fostering a collaborative and inclusive work environment and generating enthusiasm and optimism for the work

- Minimum of 5+ years of senior leadership experience, with demonstrated success in leading a healthy and innovative organization
- Proven executive leadership experience in nonprofit organizations, with a background in arts education, education policy, and/or advocacy preferred or a Bachelor's degree in a related field
- Proven ability and commitment to lead through DEIB practices and values
- A demonstrated success in fundraising 5-7 figure gifts including experience in grant writing and donor relations; experience in networking and partnership development
- Exceptional interpersonal and communication skills with experience in crisis management and adaptability, including the ability to navigate uncertainty, pivot strategies as needed, and lead effectively during challenges
- Ability to work effectively with diverse partners and steward relationships across diverse sectors, including government, nonprofit, and for-profit organizations
- Experience managing and developing a team
- Comfort with media relations, both written statements, testimony, and on-camera visibility
- Knowledge of California's education landscape and arts education initiatives is a plus
